From the Pastor's Desk

Dear Family and friends of First Lutheran,

"And Jesus departed from there, skirted the Sea of Galilee, and went up on the mountain and sat down there. Then great multitudes came to Him, having with them those who were lame, blind, mute, maimed, and many others; and they laid them down at Jesus' feet, and He healed them. So the multitude marveled when they saw the mute speaking, the maimed made whole, the lame walking, and the blind seeing; and they glorified the God of Israel." -Mt. 15:29-31

Among all the technology, electronics, halls of education and vast sea of people on FB today, search the world and see if you can find anyone like our Lord Jesus! Search among the ancient Egyptians, Greeks, Romans; go among the Muslims, Hindus and Americans; look among the Baptists, Methodists and Lutherans. Search among the wise of the past and present, among the mighty intellects, the great and good among Wikipedia. Search among the Democrats and Republicans, if you can, among the poor and the rich, among red and yellow, black and white; climb up to the heights of the prayer flags on Everest or down to the depths; there is none like Jesus. Mission News......from our Church in Haiti

Dear Brothers, Sisters & Supporters of the ministry of the Good Shepherd Evangelical Lutheran Church, Port-au-Prince, Haiti:

Grace and Peace to you from God our Lord and Savior Jesus! We give thanks unto the Lord, for He is good and His mercy endures forever. The Good Shepherd Evangelical Lutheran Church is more than delighted to write this in which she is expressing her thankfulness and gratitude to each one of you for your continuing prayers and support.

More than ever, we need to continue to stay in God's presence, preach His inspired Word, and administer the Sacraments as we are facing difficult times. Only in Him that we can we find relief and strength permitting us to endure the difficult times. The instability of our nation causes a lot of trouble among the citizens and in the different neighborhoods. As you probably know, Good Shepherd is ministering in four places in the Port-au-Prince area: Delmas, Village of Peace, Leogane and Village Coracess. We have a tight schedule. Since the beginning of the ministry we always have two worship services in each of these places (a worship service in the morning and an evangelism service in the evening where non-converts are invited to join us). But nowadays the evening service at Village of Peace is held at 4:00 pm because of the gangs that are performing there. From 6:00 pm to 6:00 am the members of the community need to be at home to make sure that they are at 50% safe. It is a complicated situation. And in all these matters we ask the question "who cares"? The answer is "only God cares". "If God is for us, who can be against us"?

The cholera problem is another issue. Hundreds of people have already passed away. They cannot survive because the health care down here is a luxury. At a certain point, sometimes we even get discouraged but after all we come to the conclusion that our God is faithful, merciful and compassionate. Yet this I call to mind and therefore I have hope: Because of the Lord's great love we are not consumed, for his compassions never fail. They are new every morning; great is your faithfulness. I say to myself, "The Lord is my portion; therefore I will wait for him (Lamentations 3:21-24)." What a friend we have in Jesus, my friend!

Thanks be to our Redeemer, in the midst of great distress and calamity, as a loving Father, He is always there to help His children. In spite of our sins and iniquities our God does not abandon us. That is why we say together with the psalmist David "I will sing to the Lord, for he has been good to me (Psalm 13:6)."

Thanks be to Him, in spite of all our difficulties, congregations and schools are making great progress. The Word is taught, the Sacraments are administered, believers are committed and new members are joining us.

Due to this chaotic situation that is going on down here and that affect our entire beings your constant prayers remain a necessity for us.

First Lutheran's Pride & Joy--Vicar Josh Arndt & Wife Ivv

Now that Joshua and I have been welcomed so warmly to California, both by the summer heat and more importantly, the entire congregation of First Lutheran Church. I would like to write a little bit about our backgrounds and what our lives were like before arriving to California. This is to ensure that whoever may not have heard these stories will be able to know a little more about our backgrounds and we can all get to know one another better.

Beginning with my husband Joshua: Joshua was born in south central Minnesota where he spent his childhood growing up on a farm. His parents, Tray and Annette, raised him and his three siblings in a faithful Christian home: where he was also shown the First Lutheran Church Newsletter importance of family and taught the value of hardwork and taking care of chores that needed to *get*

done. When you work hard, playing hard comes naturally which is why I have always seen his hardwork complemented with lots of fun. Most of the time, his ideas of fun consist of doing active things out of doors, like hiking, mountain biking, etc.

Joshua is the oldest of four kids in his family.

Despite being born with glaucoma; Joshua has never let his disability stop him from enjoying the gift of life his Savior Jesus Christ has given to him. Joshua has learned to read both print and brail, but has learned over time that braille is a much more efficient way of reading than trying to read print; even though this was not always the case. Early on he preferred to use print as much as possible simply because it was what everyone else in school used.

Joshua attended Bethany Lutheran College in Mankato, Minnesota which was about a half hour from where he grew up. Initially Joshua had thoughts of becoming an elementary school teacher however, spending a couple years immersed in a Christian college allowed the Holy Ghost to work the desire to become a pastor into Joshua's heart. After graduating Bethany Lutheran College with a degree in Religious Studies, Joshua continued his education and began his studies at Concordia Theological Seminary, in Fort Wayne Indiana; which is when we met.

Before getting into our relationship together, I'll take a few steps back and say a little bit about my childhood. Completely opposite from Joshua who is the eldest child, I am the youngest of four children. Like Joshua, I absolutely love to be out of doors and that is exactly where most of my childhood was spent.

Moving was a very common thing in for our family because my father Jeffrey, was an Army Chaplin. My mother, Ranita, has a deep appreciation and understanding for the value of committing time to family which motivated her to home-school us. I was home-schooled through fifth grade, and in my early teen years our family moved to Michigan. This is where our family has lived ever since and is also where I attended college at Concordia University, Ann Arbor. During my time spent at Ann Arbor, I studied and received a degree in Criminal Justice. Now that you have been caught up on our lives, let's go back to last summer when Joshua and I first met. We were both working at a Lutheran summer camp

near Buffalo New York. Joshua was working as one of two camp Vicars and I was the camp -5-

photographer. It didn't take long after meeting one another for us to realize how much we had in common and how well we got along. Practically all of our free-time was spent talking with one another or going on fun adventures, just getting to know one another. We also started reading the Bible together and learned how much we both love Jesus and the life we have in Him.

After that summer ended Joshua returned to the Seminary in Fort Wayne and I started my final year of college at Ann Arbor, which is about two hours from Fort Wayne. We talked on the phone every night often times for over an hour, and I would drive to visit every weekend I could. Josh and I continued dating for six months and then got engaged in December of 2015. We planned the wedding for the upcoming June. On June tenth, we were married—a couple weeks before leaving for vicarage here in California.

That brings us once again, to the present time. Hopefully this helps fill in a few gaps about Joshua and myself. Of course if you have more questions feel free to ask either of us, and we look forward to sharing our first year of marriage together with you all. Based on how welcoming and supportive everyone has been it is clear to see the joy we share in Jesus and this will be a fantastic year.

What can Lutherans do as voices in the public square?

As some Lutherans might struggle to grasp how to apply Luther's doctrine of the two kingdoms regarding matters of church and state, the staff of the Synod's Commission on Theology and Church Relations (CTCR) offers some clarification: One God rules the world (1 Tim. 1:17), but in two different ways in two different "realms." This twofold reality produces tensions for the Christian that are not easily resolved.

In His "kingdom of grace," where Christ reigns, He uses His Word and Sacraments to bring people to faith without coercion and to glad acceptance of His rule and authority (see John 3:3; 18:36; Col. 1:13-14; 2 Peter 1:11).

In His "kingdom of power," His temporal or earthly kingdom, God uses governments to maintain order,

stability and justice in this sinful, imperfect world (see Rom. 13:1-5; 1 Peter 2:13-14, 17).

Thus, Jesus Himself tells us to render to Caesar and to God (Matt. 22:21). And, even as Christians honor and obey governing authorities, they must boldly disobey government when it usurps God's authority (Acts 5:29). In short, just as Christians respect human authority, they are also free to engage with government to prevent governments from acting unjustly
